

SAMUEL FULLER OF THE *MAYFLOWER*

Among those on board the ship *Mayflower* when it finally arrived in New England in November, 1620 was Pilgrim Samuel Fuller.

Samuel was baptized in Redenhall, Norfolk, England on 20 January 1580. He married his first wife, Alice Glascock, but they had no children before she died in 1613 at Leyden, Holland. He married a second time to Agnes Carpenter but she died on 3 July 1615 at Leyden, Holland. He married a third time to Bridget Lee on 27 May 1617.

Samuel was a deacon in the church at Leyden, Holland and also at Plymouth. He was a physician and surgeon and provided medical service to both Plymouth Colony and the neighboring Massachusetts Bay Colony. In 1632, he was an Assistant in the Colony Governor's Council. Samuel died between 30 July 1633 and 28 October 1633.

Samuel's widow, Bridget, opened a small private school after her husband's death, then served as a midwife in Rehoboth. She died after 1664.
