Having undertaken, for the glory of God, and advancement of the Christian faith, and honor of our King and Country, a voyage to plant the first colony in the northern parts of Virginia, do by these presents solemnly and mutually, in the presence of God, and one of another, covenant and combine our selves together into a civil body politic, for our better ordering and preservation and furtherance of the ends aforesaid; and by virtue hereof to enact, constitute, and frame such just and equal laws, ordinances, acts, constitutions and offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the general good of the Colony, unto which we promise all due submission and obedience. In witness whereof we have hereunder subscribed our names at Cape Cod, the eleventh of November, in the year of the reign of our sovereign lord, King James, of England, France, and Ireland, the eighteenth, and of Scotland the fifty-fourth. Anno Dom. 1620.

It was exciting to visit with many potential, future Mayflower cousins and to feel their enthusiasm.

We encouraged many to visit the General Society of Mayflower Descendants' (GSMD's) Society House and gardens located at 4 Winslow Street, Plymouth, Massachusetts. Of particular interest are the garden's memorial brick pavers. Directly behind the Mayflower house is the GSMD Library, equipped with a knowledgeable staff ready to assist researchers, historians, genealogists, and tourists alike. The society offers scholarship opportunities - as well as scholarly

Greetings, Utah Mayflower Society Members!

The General Society of Mayflower Descendants (GSMD) is deeply engaged in documenting descendants of the Mayflower Pilgrims, and FamilySearch is deeply engaged in preserving genealogical documents. Both, in partnership with the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS), are connecting and preserving a documented lineage collection of Mayflower descendants called The Mayflower Project.

"The resulting lineage database is extremely important because it is documented," said David Barss, Project Manager with FamilySearch. A person who finds an ancestor in this data should be able to move up or down the tree to see his or her family.

GSMD is providing access to their records and space for FamilySearch to digitally preserve them. GSMD and NEHGS will help with a scholarly review of the finished merged files. FamilySearch will share digitized copies of the documents and indexes with GSMD and NEHGS.

FamilySearch is digitizing and indexing:

- Generational index cards to Mayflower Applications.
- Lineages on GSMD Applications (1896-2019).
 Images, extracted data, and GEDCOM files will be posted to FamilySearch for people born more than 100 years ago. For privacy, current names will not be included.
- GSMD published a series of books of fivegenerations descendant Mayflower Pilgrim genealogies. These volumes with silver-colored bindings are often referred to as the "Silver Books." FamilySearch is converting NEHGS indexes of Silver Books to GEDCOM Files. Starting with Silver Book information,

FamilySearch will add data from the applications to create a unique file for each Pilgrim then merge those Pilgrim files into a single, searchable Mayflower database to be published on the FamilySearch website with linked images and shared with GSMD & NEHGS.

The Silver Book series is on the second floor of the Family History Library filed as 974.4 D2mf and on microfilm. The Family History Library is located directly across West Temple Street from the Tabernacle on Temple Square.

Meet Our Guest Speaker – David S. Barss

Project Manager for FamilySearch/GSMD/NEHGS 2020 Mayflower Digitization Project

David S. Barss has been involved in genealogical research and related activities since he graduated from Utah State University with a bachelor's degree in history in 1977. As an Accredited Genealogist specializing in the New England and Mid-Western States of the United States, he has shared his expertise both personally and professionally from that day forward. Earlier in his career, he managed lineage linked databases for genealogical companies. From there he devoted five years to doing client

research in the records for the United States and Canada, working in the New England, Mid-Western, Mid-Atlantic, and Southern States, plus occasionally the records of England, Ireland, and Scotland.

In 1991 Barss became a full-time employee of what is now FamilySearch International, working in the Family History Library as a reference consultant for United States and Canada records - and later serving as supervisor for that unit. He began working with the database that would eventually generate the International Genealogical Index in 1998. In 2006 he began working on the Community Trees Project, an effort to build the genealogy of a whole community (town or county, or ethnic or religious



group, etc.) from their extracted records. This process is currently called Family Reconstitution - and Barss is still very much involved in those efforts. FamilySearch has published 220 Community Trees, and more are in process. The largest collection is the Norway Project with 155 Clerical Districts published so far. He later contributed his expertise to publish 46 million records from an older extraction process - and additionally served as Project Manager for the publication of FamilySearch's Sub-Saharan Africa Oral Genealogies Project.
